2021 LOC Board of Directors

Position Open

The LOC's Bylaws provide for 9 Elected City Official Director positions on the Board. Directors represent all geographic regions of the state and varied city populations. Directors serve three-year terms that begin with the first meeting of the new calendar year following the election. For the 2021 Board of Directors, there are three open seats for the Elected Official Director positions.

New LOC Board members will be given an orientation in early December. The new term of office begins with the first meeting of 2021, usually held in late January or early February.

Nomination Process for Appointed Officials

All candidates for the Board position designated for an Elected City Official Director will be expected to do the following:

Complete an Application Form. Return a completed Application Form (next page) to LOC offices by **September 29**, **2020**. This will provide the Nominating Committee with general background on all candidates for office. Appear Before the Nominating Committee. The LOC Nominating Committee will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, October 14, the platform is TBA. Each applicant will be given a set amount of time to address the committee.
