Funding Sources

- **Near term**

- \$500K, EDA Grant for Broadband Mapping
- \$1.5M, Oregon Broadband Fund (Universal Service Fund)
- **\$157M, ARPA Capital Projects**

- **Long term**

- \$100M+Formula, IIJA – Broadband Equity, Access & Deployment
- \$Formula, IIJA – Digital Equity

Federal Guidance – ARPA Broadband Infrastructure Projects

- **Must reliably meet or exceed 100 Mbps download / 100 Mbps upload (aka “100/100”)**
 - 100/20 Mbps for exceptions, but must be scalable to 100/100
- **“Last Mile” focus. Middle mile projects must incorporate a last-mile deployment.**
- **Serve locations lacking 25/3 Mbps service**
- **Goal: Offer 100/100 at an affordable price**

Private Activity Bonds

Authorizes State/local gov'ts to use private activity bonds for rural broadband

Title I - Broadband Equity, Access & Deployment Program

Formula-based grant program for U.S. states and territories. BEAD aims to close the access gap for unserved & underserved areas of the country.

Title III - Digital Equity Act

Three programs, established for planning & implementation of programs that promote digital equity, support digital inclusion activities, and build capacity related to the adoption of broadband.

Title II - Tribal Connectivity Technical Amendments

Furtheres current Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program by investing an additional \$2B to fund broadband adoption and infrastructure projects.

Title IV - Enabling Middle Mile Broadband Infrastructure

Provides funding to extend middle mile capacity to reduce cost of serving unserved and underserved areas and enhance network resilience.
