2022 SESSION

• Important Dates and Timeline

- February 1, 2022 Start of Session
- Sine Die March 4, three days early
- March 8 Filing Day

• Major Issues

- COVID-19 and Public Health Emergency
- Agriculture worker overtime
- PPP for behavioral health providers
- Capitol renovation funding Phase 3
- \$2.7 billion new spending

2022 SESSION CONT.

- Tensions
 - Walkout threats
 - Senate vs. House ideology
 - New leadership
 - 2022 election



MAJOR FINANCIAL INVESTMENTS

- \$400 million to address housing and homelessness
- \$200 million to fund Governor Kate Brown's 'Future Ready Oregon' initiative
- \$180 million to send \$600 stimulus payments to Oregonians most adversely impacted by the pandemic
- \$150 million to create summer learning programs to make up for educational progress lost during the pandemic
- \$120 million to develop a bridge plan for individuals at risk of losing Medicaid coverage after the public health emergency is over
- \$132 million in general in grants to behavioral health providers







2022 ELECTION AND INTERIM



- May 17 Primary
- November 8 General
- Legislative turnover
 - Nearly half the body has not experienced an inperson session
 - All 60 Representatives and 15 of 30 Senators up for re-election
- Impact of redistricting
 - New legislative districts

2022 ELECTION AND INTERIM

- Gubernatorial race
 - Field continues to expand
 - First legitimate three-way race in over 40 years
 - Record spending expected
- Other races of note
 - BOLI Commissioner
 - Congressional Seats –
 New CD 6
