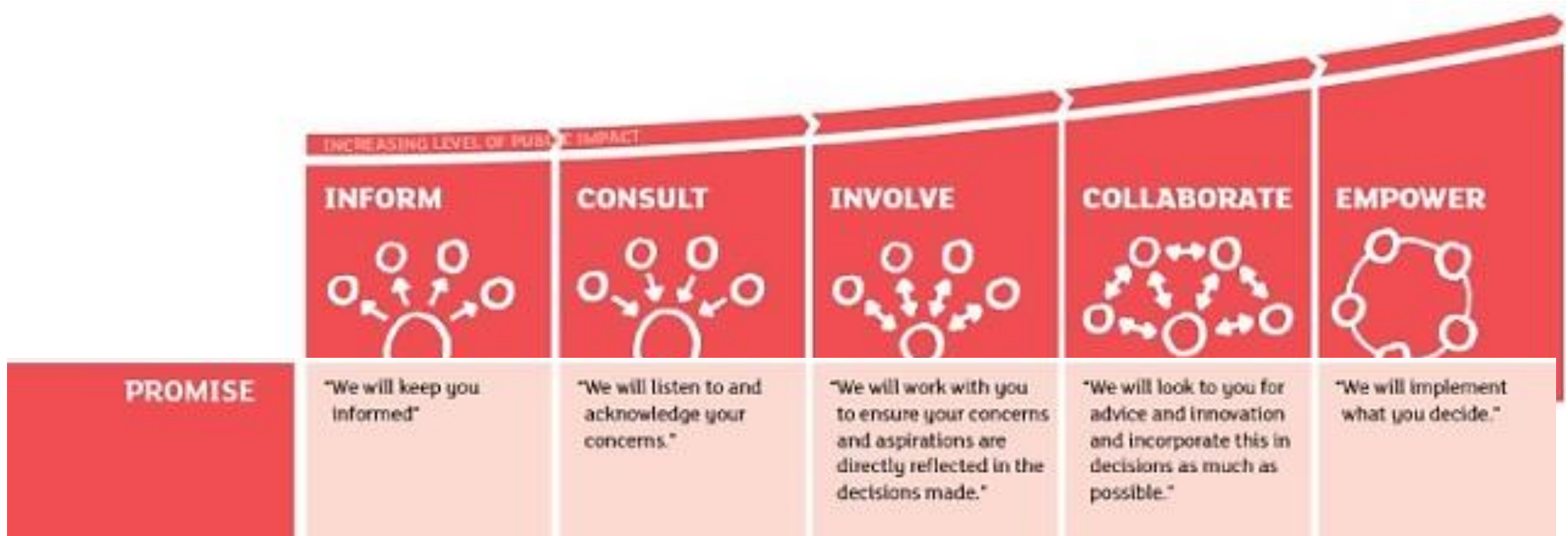

IAP2 Spectrum of Participation

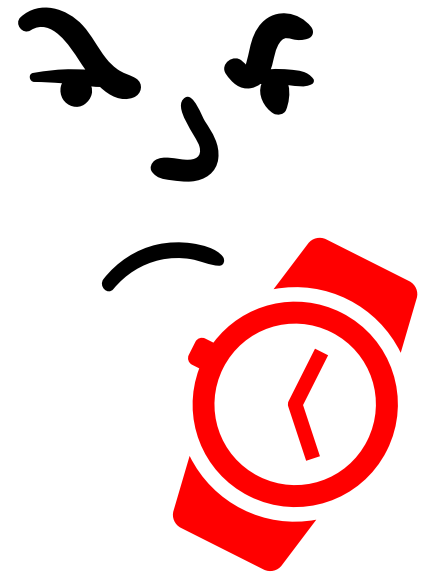

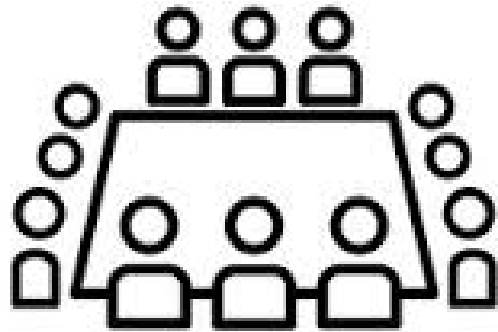
Protect the Public's Time

- The law requires public meetings to **allow for attendance, not speaking time**
- **Limitations** on free speech must be “**viewpoint neutral**”
- It is your job to **minimize disruption** and allow for an exchange of ideas in public deliberation
 - You are not required to “grant access to all who wish to exercise their right to free speech on every type of government property, at any time, without regard to the disruption caused by the speaker’s activities”
(Walsh v. Enge, Cornelius v. NAACP 1985)

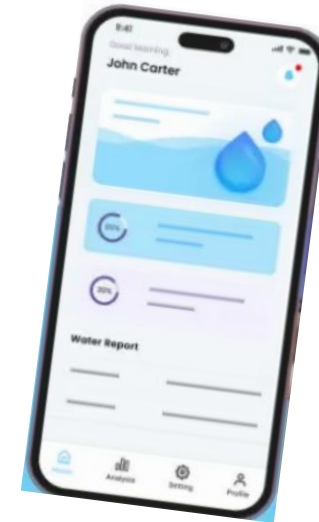

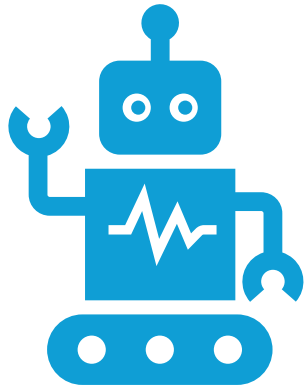

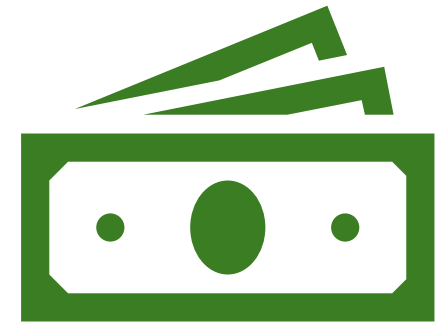
Group 1: AI in the Gym
